SAIGON TO ANGKOR OR V.V.

DAY 1, SUNDAY

AUSTRALIA~SINGAPORE~SAIGON

Fly with Singapore Airlines to Saigon via Singapore. On arrival into Saigon, you'll be transferred to the Caravelle Hotel for a 2 night stay.

DAY 2, MONDAY (B, L) SAIGON

Enjoy a morning sightseeing tour with your local guide, visiting some of the 'essential sights' of this city, including its Reunification Palace, once known as the Presidential Palace. You'll also visit the picturesque colonial City Hall, General Post Office, Former US Embassy, Ben Thanh Market and Notre Dame Cathedral.

DAY 3, TUESDAY (B, L, D) SAIGON~MYTHO

Transfer to My Tho Cruise Port to board the new Indochina Pandaw. Sail upstream before mooring near Cai Be. Enjoy a fascinating trip by traditional junk to explore evergreen islands and An Kiet House, the former Imperial residence. Indochina will moor mid-stream overnight in Cai Be.

DAY 4, WEDNESDAY (B, L, D) CAI BE-VINH LONG

Take a junk trip around Cai Be to the floating market, going ashore to visit the French Gothic Cathedral and port area's colonial buildings, delightful flower gardens and local rice paper manufacturers. Return to the ship and then cruise over to Vinh Long to visit a Bonsai garden and fruit farm, followed by a visit to a brick and pottery factory. Returning to the Indochina, cruise past Vinh Long City and the evergreen islands before passing through the Mekong Delta.

DAY 5, THURSDAY (B, L, D) CHAU DOC / BORDER CROSSING

Crossing from the main Mekong channel at Tan Chau, you'll travel by local ferry boat through canals and backwaters. Arrive at Chau Doc to transfer to a smaller boat to visit a Cham tribal village and cat fish farm. Then enjoy a trishaw ride round this fascinating town of fine French-colonial buildings and its bustling market. Return to the ship and cast off for the Cambodian border. The evening's cruise takes you up the broad Mekong channel, an international shipping route, for an overnight mooring near Phnom Penh.

DAY 6, FRIDAY (B, L, D) PHNOM PENH

The capital of Cambodia retains its French charm with several impressive wats, including Wat Ounalom, Wat Phnom and the newly-painted Wat Lang Ka. Take an afternoon excursion into the suburbs for a very moving Killing Fields visit, including the Khmer Rouge's grim Tuol Sleng (or S21 detention centre). Afterwards, spend some time at the Russian or Central markets.

DAY 7, SATURDAY (B, L, D) PHNOM PENH / KAMPONG CHAM

Indochina Pandaw departs early from Phnom Penh for a stop at the little-known Chong Koh silk weaving village. Cruise past the Mekong's timeless villages, river life and extensive fishing activities, before stopping at Peam Chi Kang village to explore this peaceful community's wat (or monastery) and school.

DAY 8, SUNDAY (B, L, D) KAMPONG CHAM AREA

Journey up river, to the hilltop, pre-Angkorian temple of Wat Hanchey. Sail back downstream for an exploration of the Kampong Cham Area. Travel by bus to the 12th century Angkorian temple of Wat Nokor, before heading to the eco village of Cheungkok.

DAY 9, MONDAY (B, L, D) TONLE RIVER

Cruise the Tonle River which connects Tonle Sap (Great Lake) with the Mekong and Bassac Rivers. Temples abound the river banks at Kampong Chhnang where you'll witness the rich tapestry of Cambodian rural life.

DAY 10, TUESDAY (B) TONLE SAP/SIEM REAP

Tonle Sap is South East Asia's largest freshwater lake. Water levels will determine your plans for disembarkation. During high water levels (usually August to November), you will cross the Tonle Lake at dawn before disembarking midmorning at Siem Reap Port. During low water levels (November to August), you will disembark early morning at Prek Dom on the Tonle River, and arrive at Siem Reap around midday. Transfer to the Victoria Angkor Resort and Spa for a 2 night stay. This afternoon, enjoy a tour to Angkor Wat - the world's largest temple.

DAY 11, WEDNESDAY (B, L) SIEM REAP

Visit the magnificent Angkor Thom; last capital of the Khmers, with its Elephant Terrace, Terrace of the Leper King and the spectacular Bayon Temple. Lunch at the Café Indochine Restaurant, before visiting Thommanon, Chau Say, Tevoda, Ta Keo and Ta Prohm.

DAY 12, THURSDAY (B) SIEM REAP~SINGAPORE~AUSTRALIA

Transfer to Siem Reap Airport for your flight home to Australia.
